Action Requested

Staff is requesting that the Board of Commissioners accept the Marine City Highway Corridor Study Report, as presented.

Background

St. Clair County, in conjunction with the St. Clair County Road Commission, the Economic Development Alliance (EDA) of St. Clair County, and Casco, China, Cottrellville, and Ira Townships, hired Wade Trim to conduct a comprehensive corridor study for the Marine City Highway Corridor in order to proactively plan for future growth and development with a full understanding of existing and future land use, transportation issues, and water/sewer infrastructure needs. The project study area extends from County Line Road to King Road in St. Clair County, approximately 11 miles in length.

Wade Trim presented an overview of the corridor study at the January 19 Board of Commissioners workshop. The draft report is posted online on the Metropolitan Planning Commission's website (<https://www.stclaircounty.org/Offices/metro/>).

While the study is complete, the Metropolitan Planning Commission will continue to work collaboratively with the communities along the corridor to proactively plan for the future of the corridor. One of the key recommendations of the study is for those communities to continue to meet regularly to better coordinate planning activities along the corridor. Metro Planning will actively engage those communities to encourage that coordination to occur. It will be up to each individual community to decide which recommendations make sense to integrate into their own master plans and ordinances.

At this time, we are requesting the Board to formally accept the Marine City Highway Corridor Study.
