RE: St. Clair County - Marysville School District  
Nursing Agreement

Dear Commissioners:

St. Clair County Health Department is requesting approval to enter in to an agreement to provide additional nursing services for the Marysville School District.

St. Clair County Health Department (SCCHD) is proposing to hire a part time Public Health Nurse (PHN) to provide SCCHD services to Marysville students three days a week. The services provided will include vaccinations, health screenings, health consultations, health education, and Covid-19 testing and guidance. The agreement is for Marysville School District (MSD) to provide SCCHD \$34.36 per hour at 22.5 hours a week. This will cover the cost for a .6 FTE Public Health Nurse (PHN).

Should this agreement ever be terminated, SCCHD would remove this nursing position from our manning table.

Due to the time it takes to hire, and with classes already under way in Marysville schools, we are respectfully requesting final action on this agreement.

# **INTER-AGENCY (Co-Operative) AGREEMENT**

**St. Clair County Health Department**

**And**

**Marysville School District**

**November 5, 2021 – June 30, 2022**

**Purpose and Funding:** The identified PARTIES, St. Clair County Health Department ["HD"], and Marysville School District ["MSD"] have developed a collaborative service delivery system to provide school-based physical health services in the Marysville schools. Any changes to the total amount of this Agreement must be made in writing as an Amendment to this Agreement and executed by all PARTIES of this Agreement.

In consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and representations herein contained, PARTIES hereto agree to the following:

## **I. HD**

- A.** Designate/advise of a contact person responsible to liaison with other PARTIES to address/resolve operational issues.
- B.** Provide all nursing staff, including one (1) .6 FTE RN to MSD to complete *Physical Health Coordination Services* such as immunizations, waiver education, general communicable disease investigation and education, CLIA waived testing, specimen collection, community resource referrals, as well as prevention education, and other physical health services as needed.
- C.** RN will submit a Wellness Center Program Plan for the 2021-22 school year by 12/1/2021 to identify goals for improving student health (such as marketing, education, presentations, school-wide awareness events, etc.)
- D.** Marketing materials will be reviewed and approved in combination with other School Wellness Center staff.
- E.** Submit a monthly report to MSD designee with information about all activities related to Wellness Center initiative, including total number of students served, administrative tasks, marketing efforts and special projects.
- F.** In the event that school becomes virtual due to COVID-19, RN shall provide virtual education events (both individual and group) to students, be physically present in the school building for walk-ins during the normal hours of operation, and develop and implement programs to reach students.
- G.** Bill insurance and/or Medicaid for covered physical health services.
- H.** Provide services to all youth regardless of insurance or ability to pay.
- I.** Submit invoice monthly to MSD district representative.

## **II. MSD**

- A.** Designate/advise of a contact person responsible to liaison with other PARTIES to address/resolve operational issues.
- B.** Provide a room with a sink for clinic and separate private office for counseling sessions.

- C. Ensure adequate desk space, including but not limited to, computer/IT connection, desk phone, fax, and copying capability.
- D. Ensure confidentiality/privacy of students.
- E. Include RN on all school communication and list services.
- F. Promote Wellness Center services to students, teachers, and administrators.
- G. Provide direction and support to Wellness Center staff for physical and mental health services/ supports provided to the school community.
- H. Ensure adequate support staff via office staff at the school is provided.
- I. Coordinate care with parents/students as needed.
- J. Provide hourly compensation at the rate of \$34.36/hour.

**III. ALL PARTIES**

- A. No persons shall be denied service solely on the basis of age, disability, race, color, creed, sex, national origin, marital status, religion, ability, or inability to pay therefore.
- B. This Agreement may be terminated by the PARTIES for its convenience, in whole or in part, by giving a written notice ninety (90) days prior to the date of termination.

If the PARTIES choose to terminate this Agreement, in part, the rates under this Agreement shall be equitably adjusted to reflect those (and/or all) *Mental and Physical Health Coordination Services* that are terminated.

### ***Points of Interest...***

- The CDC recently expanded eligibility of the COVID-19 vaccine booster shots for certain populations. Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson booster shots are offered at various locations across St. Clair County. For more information visit: <https://www.vaccines.gov/>.
- St. Clair County Health Department (SCCHD) is partnering with the Blue Water Recovery and Outreach (BWROC) to provide peer recovery services on site at SCCHD as well as on the mobile unit. SCCHD is excited about the addition of a peer recovery coach to enhance interactions by improving conversations and pathways to recovery with those clients seeking harm reduction services through The ExCHANGE; SCCHD's syringe and clean works program.
- The SCCHD Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP) was one of ten Michigan MIHP agencies selected to participate in the MIHP Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) Plan of Care 2 Pilot project. In December, staff will participate in two ACES trainings, with receiving a \$1500 stipend. The Pilot Project is slated to begin January 2022 and go through August 2022.
- Hearing & Vision Technicians are currently screening in local schools and Head Start facilities. During this process masks are required, the Technicians wear one, while providing pediatric and adult sized masks for participants. The facility is informed of the mask requirement during the screening process, and the school personnel post the announcement in their newsletters for the parents' knowledge.
- The Childhood Lead Poisoning and Prevention Program Case Manager is providing home visits and some private physician offices are able to provide lead testing, administering results to the State and SCCHD. However, due to the recall of the LeadCare II blood lead test kits, WIC is un-able at this time to provide capillary lead tests. The Case Management nurse continues to supply education for parents/guardians regarding nutrition, cleaning and risk reduction, as well as home visits available for eligible children.
- On Friday, October 29<sup>th</sup> the SCCHD will be participating in the Council on Aging's 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Senior Power Day at the Washington Life Center location, offering vaccines for: COVID-19, including boosters, Hepatitis A and Pneumonia.
